School building condition



The condition of our school buildings has been evaluated by an independent consultant, MGT of America. The consultant's report showed which buildings are in the worst condition and made some recommendations about where to begin. The report is a starting point for conversation.

Each school building was assessed in four major areas:

Building condition (40% of combined score) – condition of all building systems (e.g., roofing, windows, mechanical, electrical). The score is weighted by building square footage, excluding portables.

Educational suitability (40%) – how well the facility supports the educational program (e.g., design, size, placement of learning spaces).

Site condition (10%) – condition of the site and its systems (e.g., paving, exterior lighting, utilities, fencing).

Technology readiness (10%) – how well the building's infrastructure supports the information technology that is critical to teaching and learning today (e.g., electrical capacity, outlets, network connectivity).

The combined score gives a comprehensive picture of the conditions that exist at each school and how each school compares relative to the other schools in the district.

Schools in bold (right) were rated in "poor" or "unsatisfactory" condition, with a combined score below 70.

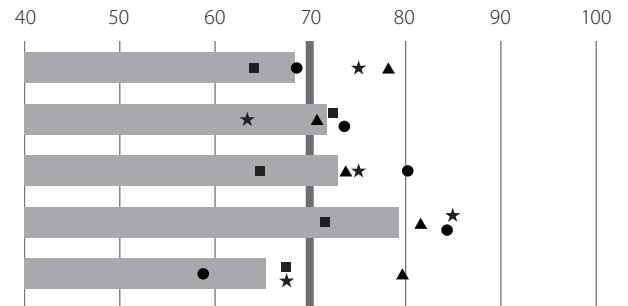

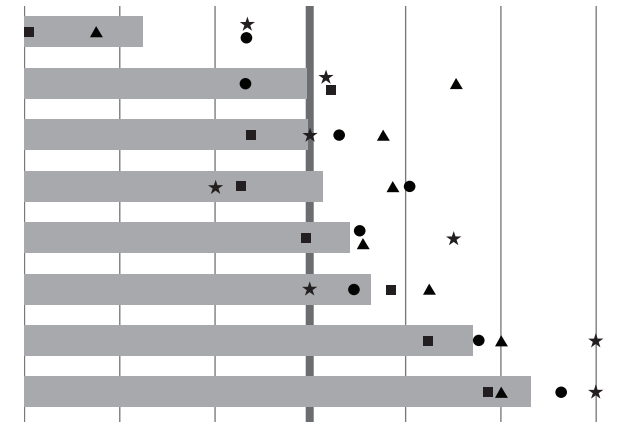

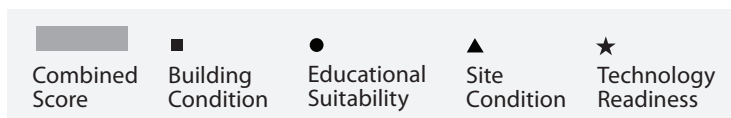
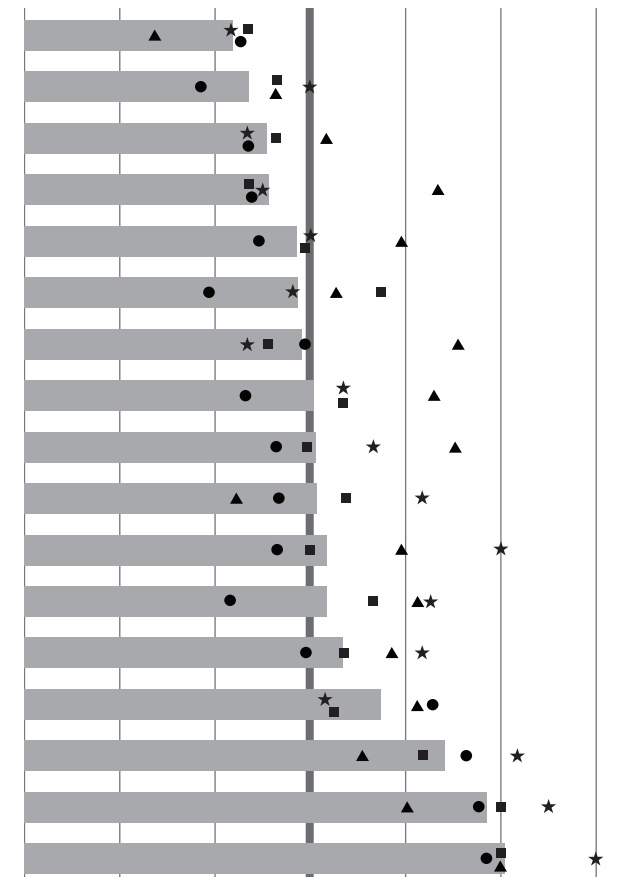
